2024 Ohio High School Baseball Coaches Association Fact Sheet

The purpose of the OHSBCA is to unify all baseball coaches in the State of Ohio, to promote high school baseball, to create an official line of communication with the Ohio High School Athletic Association (OHSAA), to foster higher standards of professionalism and ethics, and to maintain a strong contact with the national, state and local coaches' organizations of baseball.

- **Membership:** approximately 1,500 coaches annually.
- **Dues:** \$40 per year due by March 15th (payable online)
- **Governing Body:** Twenty-eight-member Board of Directors with thirteen serving on the executive board.

OFFICIAL ORGANIZATION FUNCTION/EVENTS:

- **A. Annual Convention and Clinic:** Held once per year at the Hilton Columbus at Easton.
- **B. Board Meetings:** Four times per year. Includes two meetings at the annual convention, a meeting at the Game One Senior All-Star Series, and a meeting in October.
- **C. OHSBCA Website:** www.ohsbca.org "X" (Formerly Twitter): (@OHSBCAwebmaster)
- **D.** Game One Senior All-Star Series: Held two weeks after the state tournament in June. The series honors eighty (80) graduated seniors and twelve member coaches. The event takes place at Bill Davis Stadium on the campus of The Ohio State University in Columbus, Ohio.
- E. Game One Junior Underclass Showcase by PBR: Run by the OHSBCA and Prep Baseball Report Ohio. 80 of the top underclass players are invited to showcase their skills in front of college coaches. This showcase is held in association with the Senior All-Star Series.
- F. State Coaches Poll: Teams are rated in each of the four divisions five times each spring. Poll champions are recognized at the annual convention. There are thirty-four (34) voting coaches in each division. Registration and membership forms to vote can be found on website.
- **G. All-State Coaches Poll Team:** The poll coaches in each division select an all-state team. All grade level of players are eligible. Each division selects a Player-of-the-Year and a Coach-of -the-Year. They are recognized by the wire services and are award-ed a plaque at the annual convention.
- H. Player-of-the-Year Award: This award will be pre-

sented at the annual convention banquet by OC Sports. Each of the four division Player-of-the-Year recipients will be recognized and one Playerof-the-Year will receive a plaque.

- I. Field of the Year Award: This award will be presented at the annual convention by Mar-Co Clay.
- J. Field of Need Award: This award will be presented at the annual convention by Pro's Choice.
- **K. Hall of Fame:** The HOF induction is the highlight of the Rawlings Hall of Fame banquet at the annual convention. The Board of Directors selects inductees. Nomination forms can be found on website.
- **L. Hank Miller Scholarships:** All graduating senior students of member coaches with five years of continuing membership are eligible. Form found on website.
- **M. Academic All-Ohio:** Selected annually and awarded certificates. Certificates are handed out at the state convention. Forms can be found on website.
- N. Service and Victory Awards: Service awards for coaches begin with the fifteenth year of membership and are awarded every five years thereafter. Victory awards begin at 100 and are awarded for every 100 victories thereafter. Certificates and plaques are awarded at the state convention.
- **O.** Assistant Coach of the Year Award: Coaches from each district are recognized as assistant coaches of the year at our annual convention. This award is sponsored by Phoenix Bat.
- **P. Past Presidents Hall of Fame:** All former OHS-BCA Presidents and Hall of Fame members are invited back for the Hall of Fame Banquet on Friday afternoon. A reception to follow immediately after the banquet.
- Q. Sean was a 1988 graduate of Ursuline High School and was a member of the 1988 AA State Championship baseball team. Durkin served as a teacher at Ursuline High School from 2004-2019 and additionally as the school's Athletic Director from 2010-2019.

On the baseball diamond, Durkin compiled a 306-138 record (1998-2015) which included 11 District Championships, 6 Regional Championships, 3 State Championship game appearances, and the 2000 Division III State Championship.

Coach Durkin was also an impressive 252-131 as the Lady Irish basketball head coach (1998-2011; 2014). He won 9 District Championships, 2 Regional Championships, and the 2004 Division III State Championship. Coach Durkin was also recognized as the 2006 Associated Press State Coach of the Year after his team finished as the Division III State Runner-Up.

Coach Durkin was inducted into the Ursuline High School Sports Hall of Fame in 2009 as a result of his success on both the diamond and the basketball court. Sean was inducted into the NEOBCA Hall of Fame in 2017. Coach Durkin passed away in 2019, leaving his parents, children, and hundreds of former players to cherish his memory.

Mark has been involved with both the Southwest Ohio Baseball Coaches Association-SWOBCA and the Miami Valley Baseball Coaches Association-MVBCA serving as President of the MVBCA. Coach Pelfrey has also served as a district rep with the OHSBCA.

Michael began as a volunteer coach in 1981 at Capital University under Head Coach Roger Welsh. In 1983 he joined the Gahanna Lincoln High School Coaching Staff. In 1992 he was named the Head Varsity Baseball Coach for the Gahanna Lincoln Golden Lions.

During his 31-year tenure as head coach, the Lions accumulated a record of 520-326. Under Coach Shade, Gahanna has won 4 OCC titles, 8 District Championships and made back-to-back trips to the State Final Four in 2013 and 2014. Twelve of Coach Shade's players have been selected to play in the All-Ohio Series. Fifteen have earned Division I Coaches All Ohio Baseball Team honors, including 3 who earned Division I State Player of the Year awards. State Players of the Year include Evan White in 2014, Cael Baker in both 2016 and 2017 and Adam Buerger in 2023. White and Buerger were also named to the ABCA All American Baseball Team their senior year. Three of Coach Shade's players have gone on to play Major League Baseball; Phillip Kline, Evan White and Jackson Wolf.

Other honors earned by Coach Shade include being inducted into the Capital University Athletic Hall of Fame in 1999 and the CDBCA Hall of Fame in 2013. Coach Shade was also inducted into the Whitehall Yearling Hall of Fame in 2016 and the Gahanna

Chris Veidt | 2024 Hall Of Fame Inductee



Chris Veidt is a 1982 graduate of Logan High School and 2023 member of the LHS Athletic Hall of Fame. Chris was fortunate enough to play High School Baseball for 2014 OHSBCA Hall of Famer Ron Janey. Veidt attended and was a member of the University of Rio Grande (83,84) and Wilmington College (85,86) Baseball squads, graduating from Wilmington in 1986 with a Degree in Health and Physical Education (K-12). Coach Veidt received his Master's Degree in Health and Sports Science (2004) from the University of Dayton.

Immediately after his College graduation he was hired to be the lead Assistant Coach under legendary Red's Hall of Famer Brooks Lawrence at Wilmington College (87-91). The Quakers captured the 1989 District 22 Championship.

In 1992 Coach Veidt was hired as the Head Baseball Coach at Whiteoak High School and is preparing to enter his 33rd consecutive season at the helm of the Wildcats. During his tenure he has amassed a 462-346 won loss record. His Whiteoak HS teams have been State ranked 10 times, finishing as State Poll Champions in 2018, and a #2 finish in 2023. His teams have won 12 Southern Hills Athletic Conference Championships, including two perfect seasons (2013 & 2018). 16 Sectional, 4 District and 1 Regional title. Whiteoak finished the 2018 season as the #1 Ranked Division 4 team in the State of Ohio and earned a trip to the OHSAA State Final Four. Veidt was also the Head Coach of Hillsboro Post 129 American Legion (1997-2001), leading them to a State Tournament berth in 1998.

OHSBCA 2024 State Coaches Poll Guidelines

During the course of the season the voting coaches of the State Coaches poll rank the top 20 teams in each of the four divisions and select an All-Ohio team. This is a recognition of OHSBCA members, their teams and their players. Numbers of voters for each district are selected based upon membership in our state organization.

The voting coaches are scattered throughout the state so that it is the responsibility of each school's coach to promote his team and its players by contacting these voters **<u>before</u>** the voting takes place.

1. 34 coaches vote in each division for the top 10 Teams.

2. The 1st Place team receives 10 points, 2nd Place receives 9 points, 3rd Place receives 8 points and so on with 10th place earning 1 point.

3. Poll Results will display the Top 20 Teams in each respective division and list any schools that received votes but did not make Top 20.

4. Coaches must be a member of the OHSBCA in order to vote, be ranked, or nominate for All-Ohio.

5. Coaches are selected by their District Representatives upon completion of the application.

6. Any head coach who is interested in voting must complete an online application. Applications are available online at www. ohsbca.org starting June 1 and ending in September 30th each year. Current Voters must re-apply each season.

7. The number of coaches voting in a district will vary, determined by the number of coaches in their respective district.(Determined by member schools per District/ Division)

8. Coaches selected to vote will be notified by their District Reps and their names /emails

will be put on the website.

9. Coaches who are eligible to vote will receive information on the voting procedure starting in late February.

10. Coaches who miss two votes will be replaced and are ineligible to be a Poll Voter the following season.

11. If your team deserves recognition, or if you have a player who should be considered All-State, be sure that the voters have the needed information before the start of the balloting by emailing them and updating team record in the weekly Google Sheet.

12. The State Coaches Poll will be conducted for <u>10 consecutive weeks</u>. Ballots will be emailed to eligible poll voters and recorded between Thursday and Sunday of the indicated weeks. Results will be online on our website the following Monday.

13. Electronic ballots to be sent to voters via email on March 14, 21, 28, April 4, 11, 18, 25, May 2, 9, 16 and 23rd. Voting begins at Noon on Friday and ends 11:59PM on Sunday.

14. The Final Ballot 10th Ballot for All-Ohio will be sent **beginning at Thursday, May 24th and Ending Midnight Sunday, May 28th** will be the All-State, Coaches Poll Team Ballot. Results released when verified by District Reps and then posted on website prior to State Tournament.


